BIBBY SHIP MANAGEMENT PASSES TRAINING MILESTONE

Bibby Ship Management has announced it has trained more than 1,000 graduates at its dynamic positioning training facility in Mumbai.

The company opened the Sir Derek Bibby maritime training centre in April 2006 in response to a lack of this type of training facility in India.
